

Officials Visit Wisconsin to Celebrate Clean Water Funding

Vice President Harris visited Milwaukee Monday to highlight the \$841 million over the next five years Wisconsin is receiving for clean water projects.

MADISON, Wis. – Monday, Vice President Kamala Harris visited Milwaukee to highlight how the Biden-Harris administration is delivering clean water for Wisconsin. President Biden’s Bipartisan Infrastructure Law makes the largest investment in water in U.S. history – with Wisconsin receiving \$841 million over the next five years for clean water projects.

Clean drinking water has been a longstanding priority for Democrats across the state, including Gov. Tony Evers, who delivered this critical investment – even while Republicans in the state legislature have made a habit of [blocking](#) clean water funding in both the state budget and federal legislation.
