In Wisconsin, the LWCF has provided approximately \$212 million to protect places like the Ice Age Trail, Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest, St. Croix National Scenic River, and Apostle Islands National Lakeshore.

The letter urges Speaker Paul Ryan to lead Congress in a pro-parks and public lands agenda, reauthorize the LWCF before it expires this year, and to protect and preserve national monuments.
