the same seat that Nelson had in the US Senate. The contrast between these decision makers is astounding. Nelson fought every day to represent Wisconsinites in Washington. Johnson fights every day to represent corporate polluters. It is sad that he responds to contributions from big oil filling his campaign war chest instead of the voices of everyday citizens demanding real solutions to climate change. He should be embarrassed by that fact," concluded Hermann.
