The USDA was created over 150 years ago by President Lincoln as the "people's department". USDA Secretary Tom Vilsack has directed agencies within the department to reduce isolation and work more collaboratively to support rural communities in their efforts to define their future in today's world economy.

The "One USDA" forum initiative in Wisconsin is supported by the leadership of all Wisconsin USDA agency leaders and includes other federal agencies with parallel missions. "These forums are meant to support public initiative, as well as gather feedback and insight from citizens and local leaders to improve the Department's capacity and service delivery." said Brad Pfaff, Executive Director of the Farm Services Agency.

The April 23rd forum will be the third regional forum sponsored by Wisconsin USDA since June of last year. Other regional forums are planned across Wisconsin.
