<u>1.2 million</u> Wisconsin seniors and other Medicare beneficiaries will save money on prescription drug costs because of President Biden's caps on out-of-pocket prescription drug and insulin costs, free vaccines, inflation rebates, and drug price negotiation program.



The Inflation Reduction Act extended the eligibility for health insurance passed in the American Rescue Plan, ensuring that <u>43,000 more Wisconsinites</u> have access to affordable health insurance in 2023 than would have without the bill.

In 2021, there were already <u>71,370</u> Wisconsin workers employed in clean energy jobs, and the Inflation Reduction Act is expanding those job opportunities. Under the Biden-Harris Administration, private companies have announced plans to invest more than <u>\$3 billion</u>

to grow Wisconsin's clean energy industry.

Wisconsin families are eligible for <u>\$149.4 million</u> in home energy rebates to help cut energy costs by weatherizing their homes and replacing old appliances with more efficient models.

Wisconsin is home to <u>over 460,000</u> small businesses, representing over 99% of all businesses in the state, and the Inflation Reduction Act will help them save money through tax credits that support the transition to clean energy practices.
