Attendees will ask their legislators to:

- Support the \$106 million plan to address PFAS contamination statewide
- Create a five-person Local Government Grant Resources Team
- Implement automatic voter registration
- Support \$10 million for expanding clean energy job training and reemployment opportunities for those joining our clean energy workforce
- Support the \$400,000 plan for the Department of Natural Resources to fund Manoomin (wild rice) restoration and public education in ceded territory waters
