

MADISON – Today, Governor Evers declared March 31, 2023 as <u>Transgender Day of Visibility</u> in Wisconsin and

commended its observance to our state's residents. Until 2021, the State of Wisconsin had never before officially recognized Transgender Day of Visibility. Under Governor Evers, our state has now recognized Transgender Day of Visibility in 2021, 2022, and 2023. State Senator Melissa Agard (D-Madison), Senate Democratic Leader, released the following statement:
