- Expanding access to VA health care services for over 3.5 million veterans who were exposed to toxic substances during their military service.
- Ensuring that America's veterans get the care they need by making sure they are screened for toxic exposure and that VA personnel have the appropriate education and training. Since the PACT Act became law, approximately 66,000 screenings for toxic exposure have been done in Wisconsin.
- Delivering critical resources to the VA to ensure it can deliver timely access to services and benefits for all veterans eligible including those already enrolled. The PACT Act has provided the VA with mechanisms to enhance claims processing and to increase the workforce.
